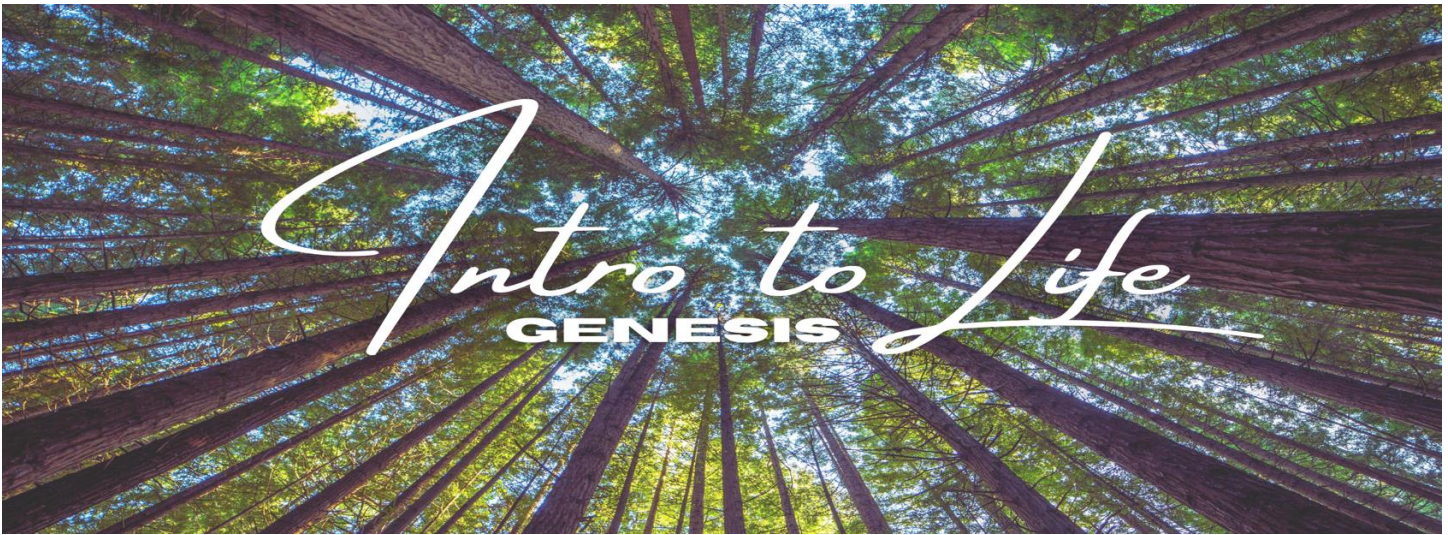

DAY 1

1.) **OBSERVE:** Look up **Genesis 1**. On the chart below, mark a check in the box by each day of creation that you find a particular phrase occurs.

DAY 2

- 1.) OBSERVE: Look up Genesis 1 and refer to the graph yesterday. While it would have aided in the memorization of the passage, the repetition of phrases discussed yesterday would have served to emphasize an importance to each of the phrases and what they mean.

Fill in the chart below with what each phrase means. Use the hints to help guide you to the correct answer.

CREATION PHRASE	IDEA IT CONVEYS
"God said, 'Let (there be) ...'"	(hint: Psalm 33:6-9)
"And it was so ..."	(hint: Isaiah 55:11)
"And God saw that it was good."	To see something is to provide it. Jerusalem – means "God saw peace." It is the city God provided peace (Col. 1:20.) Mankind goes downhill when they begin "seeing" for themselves ex. Gen 3:6.
"God called ..."	(hint: Gen. 2:19; Eph. 1:20-21 – Notice the link between mans' rule and naming)
"And there was evening and there was morning the __ day."	(hint: Exodus 20:11a)

- 2.) Which phrase stood out to you the most? How does this change your perception of God?

DAY 3

1.) OBSERVE: Read Matthew 8:23-27.

How does Jesus calm the storm? What is the storm's response?

APPLY: The cosmos obeys the commands of our God, yielding to His will without hesitation or resistance. What clear command of God causes you to hesitate or resist?

How does the creation account instruct you to respond?

DAY 4

OBSERVE: In Genesis 1 creation is formless and void (vs 2). As God begins to form and fill, write in what he makes each day. Note the break in poetic form on Day 6 when He makes man.
